From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

When we celebrated the feast of Epiphany, we reflected on the messages the three wise men taught us. It is interesting to consider why we call them wise. Though they knew they were right to recognize the message from God of the New Born King their wisdom had equipped them with the humility to submit themselves to be led by a strange star.

Correspondingly, many a time we think that we know better, especially most of the younger generation of our homes, but are we submissive to those who guide us and lead us to the Lord? The secular society is pushing the younger generation to be totally independent of the guidance of the parents and make their own choices regarding faith and life which is mostly against the Catholic tradition. It is the repetition of the temptation by devil in the Garden of Eden where the agenda of rebellion and defiance against the will of God was instilled into human minds. The beauty of Christian faith and Catholic Tradition is our constant preoccupation to discern the Will of God and the genuine readiness to always accept whatever we have to face on our faith journey, whether we like it or not. It is not the obstacles, the hardships, or even the victories on our way that determine our happiness. A prayerful perseverance is our working capital. Hardships in life on our effort to encounter the New Born King will not deter us from our journey to Him. "Hallowed be Thy Name, Thy Kingdom come and Thy will be done" is our marching tune. This is what Jesus taught us to pray for. This is what Mary exemplified in her life. This is what the Apostles and numerous saints in the church modelled for us. This is the true Catholic mindset. During this New Year we must make sure to safeguard this Catholic Tradition every day. Then we will avoid the road to destruction of our faith and our salvation. Due to the exhaustive flooding messages of the social media, most of us, especially the younger generation, do not take prayerful time to be sensitive about this Catholic Tradition. The trip of the wise men was long and tedious. After entering the palace they recognized the foolishness of human perceptions. Due to their perseverance and prayerful discernment of God's will to avoid the evil powers of this world, they successfully continued their faith journey.

During this New Year, we must persevere on our faith journey to encounter the Lord regularly. We must always be mindful of God's Will in every situation of life. We must consciously avoid becoming advocates of the secular agenda of the world. We must prayerfully continue our life's journey as courageous disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ and encourage our children to do so. God bless you all.

Cuando celebramos la fiesta de la Epifanía, reflexionamos sobre los mensajes que nos enseñaron los Reyes Magos. Es interesante considerar por qué los llamamos sabios. Aunque sabían que tenían razón al reconocer el mensaje de Dios del Rey Recién Nacido, su sabiduría los había equipado con la humildad para someterse a ser guiados por una estrella extraña. En consecuencia, muchas veces pensamos que sabemos más, especialmente la mayoría de la generación más joven de nuestros hogares, pero ¿somos sumisos a aquellos que nos guían y nos conducen al Señor? Debemos continuar con oración la jornada de nuestra vida como valientes discípulos del Señor Jesucristo y alentar a nuestros hijos a que lo hagan. Dios los bendiga a todos.

Did the first reading from Isaiah sound familiar? It was also heard on the first Sunday of Advent in December of 2008. I suppose it could be a reminder that John the Baptist appears at the beginning of the Advent/Christmas season and at the end. In Advent we were preparing for Jesus' coming at Christmas. Now we are preparing for his coming at any time.

The reading from Isaiah talks about the Lord coming in mercy to the people whose "guilt is expiated" (Isaiah 40:2). With our sins forgiven we need not fear asking God for help: "Fear not to cry out" (Isaiah 40:9). The Lord comes in power, not to strike sinners down but to shepherd them and lead them.

In the second reading, St. Paul has a similar theme. Jesus gave his life for us on the cross so that we could be free to give ourselves in love as he did. No matter how bad I was in the past, the Lord loves me enough to forgive it all, and even better, to give the Spirit to help me stay close to God.

How do we prepare for this? We can start by hearing the words of the readings today, letting them sink into our hearts and minds. Ask the Spirit to help look for ways you can be more loving with your family, then with your friends, and eventually with anyone who needs your help. When we let that Spirit guide us, we become like Jesus in that we can listen for God to say, "You are my beloved child; with you I am well pleased" (see Luke 3:22).



MUERTE Y RESURRECCIÓN BAUTISMAL

A medida que celebramos el Bautismo del Señor, también honramos nuestro propio bautismo como nuestra iniciación en la vida y comunidad cristiana. En el Evangelio, el bautismo de Jesús, con su inmersión y posterior salida del agua, indica su posterior entrega a Dios en su muerte, y su salida del sepulcro en su resurrección. Como seguidores de Jesús, esta forma de muerte y resurrección también es nuestro camino. A lo largo de la vida, y a menudo de manera limitada, aprendemos a renunciar a nuestros planes egoístas y limitados. Esta renuncia a menudo se siente como la muerte. El Sacramento del Bautismo ritualmente representa este camino para recordarnos la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, para que nosotros también podamos aceptar las muertes y resurrecciones de nuestras propias vidas. BAPTISMAL DEATH AND RESURRECTION

As we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we also honor our own baptism as our initiation into the Christian life and community. In the Gospel, the baptism of Jesus, with his immersion and then emergence from the water, points to his later submission to God at his death, and his emergence from the grave at his resurrection. This pattern of death and resurrection is our path too, as followers of Jesus. Throughout life, often in small ways, we learn to surrender our limited and self-centered agendas. This surrender often feels like death. The sacrament of Baptism ritually enacts this pattern to remind us of Jesus' death and resurrection, so that we too might embrace the deaths and resurrections of our own lives. As Jesus emerged from the water, he encountered his Father and the Holy Spirit. Like Jesus, we can know we are God's beloved, empowered by the Spirit. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.


****Sacrament of Marriage** - Couples should contact the Pastor (336-629-0221) at least 6 months prior to the wedding date for necessary preparation.



The Baptism of the Lord is observed as a distinct feast in the Roman rite, although it was originally one of three Gospel events marked by the feast of the Epiphany. Long after the visit of the Magi had in the West overshadowed the other elements commemorated in the Epiphany, Pope Pius XII instituted in 1955 a separate liturgical commemoration of the Baptism.

The Tridentine Calendar had no feast of the Baptism of the Lord for almost four centuries. Then the feast was instituted, under the denomination "Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord", for celebration on 13 January as a major double, using for the Office and the Mass those previously said on the Octave of the Epiphany, which Pius XII abolished; but if the Commemoration of the Baptism of Our Lord occurred on Sunday, the Office and Mass were to be those of the Feast of the Holy Family without any commemoration.^[1]


In his revision of the calendar five years later, Pope John XXIII kept on 13 January the "Commemoration of the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ", with the rank of a second-class feast.

A mere 14 years after the institution of the feast, Pope Paul VI set its date as the first Sunday after January 6 (as early as January 7 or as late as January 13) or, if in a particular country the Epiphany is celebrated on Sunday January 7 or Sunday January 8, on Monday January 8 or Monday January 9.^[2]

Pope John Paul II initiated a custom whereby on this feast the Pope baptizes babies in the Sistine Chapel.
