

## From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

Parental communication and daily dialogue with children are very essential for healthy personality development and strong faith foundation for children. Traditionally we say that a family that prays together, eats together stays together. Today something more is needed to be together happy and healthy. That is interpersonal communication. Just like communication is essential to marriage stability and deeper intimacy facilitating a happy family so also it is basic to successful parenting. Some parents are only concerned about providing plenty of food and a place to stay. That only helps physical health. When you have little children both parents have to plan together how to promote their spiritual, emotional and intellectual development in addition to just physical. Traditionally these things happen automatically. But not any more.

There are powers out there to mould your children their way if you are not cautious to raise them your way. Remember parents' promise to God at baptism to raise the children in faith and devotion. Give strong spiritual foundation through your model of daily prayers and helping them to learn to pray. Talk to them about Jesus and Mother Mary. Showing their pictures parents teach children to love them and pray to them and sing devotional songs daily. Just like spiritual, emotional health is very important. Parents model the appreciation of feelings of each other and encourage the same with children. Parents discuss daily issues respectfully and model healthy communication for children. Every day or at least weekends sit together and talk about how things going and what are the frustrations and plans. Talk with them how faith and prayer helped you to deal with challenges. Do not be shy to tell children how hard work is and how you manage the money. But never compare with other families. Create joy in what God has given you in your family. Talk with children your dreams about them. Hear from them their hopes and dreams and how they plan to work on them. Be realistic and practical. Talk with children how to behave at home, in school, in the church and in the mall. Talk with them how to avoid greed and learn to spend within the means. Comparison with others generates greed. Find time to pray together and play together. Limit your time to tv and social media. These two will destroy the family togetherness. Do garden work of any sort. Always play with your children, whether in door or outdoor games. If you don't play go with when they do. Even if you don't understand participate with their homework daily. This will keep them punctual. Remember if you are not involved with your children some one else will encroach your territory and you will lose them.

La comunicación de los padres y el diálogo diario con los niños son muy esenciales para el desarrollo saludable de la personalidad y una sólida base de fe para los niños.

Tradicionalmente decimos que una familia que ora unida, come unida permanece unida. Hoy se necesita algo más para estar juntos felices y sanos. Eso es comunicación interpersonal. Así como la comunicación es esencial para la estabilidad del matrimonio y una intimidad más profunda que facilita una familia feliz, también es básica para una crianza exitosa. Algunos padres solo se preocupan por proporcionar suficiente comida y un lugar donde quedarse. Eso solo ayuda a la salud física. Cuando tienes niños pequeños, ambos padres tienen que planificar juntos cómo promover su desarrollo espiritual, emocional e intelectual además del físico.

Tradicionalmente, estas cosas suceden automáticamente. Pero ya no más. Hay poderes para moldear a sus hijos a su manera si no tiene cuidado de criarlos a su manera. Recuerde la promesa que los padres le hicieron a Dios en el bautismo de criar a sus hijos en la fe y la devoción. Brinde una base espiritual sólida a través de su modelo de oraciones diarias y ayúdeles a aprender a orar. Hábleles de Jesús y de la Madre María. Mostrando sus fotos, los padres enseñan a los niños a amarlos y rezarles y cantar canciones devocionales todos los días. Al igual que la salud espiritual, emocional es muy importante. Los padres modelan la apreciación de los sentimientos del otro y fomentan lo mismo con los niños. Los padres discuten los problemas diarios con respeto y modelan una comunicación saludable para los niños. Todos los días o al menos los fines de semana se sientan juntos y hablan sobre cómo van las cosas y cuáles son las frustraciones y los planes. Hable con ellos sobre cómo la fe y la oración lo ayudaron a enfrentar los desafíos. No sea tímido para decirles a los niños lo duro que es el trabajo y cómo administra el dinero. Pero nunca compares con otras familias. Crea alegría en lo que Dios te ha dado en tu familia. Habla con los niños de tus sueños sobre ellos.

Escuche de ellos sus esperanzas y sueños y cómo planean trabajar en ellos. Sea realista y práctico. Hable con los niños sobre cómo comportarse en casa, en la escuela, en la iglesia y en el centro comercial. Hable con ellos sobre cómo evitar la codicia y aprender a gastar dentro de los medios. La comparación con los demás genera codicia. Encuentre tiempo para orar juntos y jugar juntos. Limite su tiempo a la televisión y las redes sociales. Estos dos destruirán la unión familiar. Hacer trabajos de jardinería de cualquier tipo. Juega siempre con tus hijos, ya sea en juegos de puerta o al aire libre. Si no juegas, ve con ellos cuando lo hagan. Incluso si no entiendes, participa con su tarea todos los días. Esto los mantendrá puntuales. Recuerde que si no está involucrado con sus hijos, alguien más invadirá su territorio y los perderá.

For a humble guy, St. Paul really tells it like it is. Paul lists those witnesses who actually saw the risen Jesus, last and least of these being Paul himself. Now we are used to thinking of Paul as one of the greatest apostles, even though we know he once persecuted Christians. So you might think he is being overly humble, like someone fishing for a compliment. No, Paul is only interested in making sure the Corinthians understand just how much God has done.

Besides being “born abnormally” (1 Corinthians 15:8), that is, coming to follow Christ in such an unusual way, he felt unworthy because of so many Christians he hurt before his conversion. Yet he turns that unworthiness into an example of how much God has done through him. So he can say that he worked harder than any other apostles because of God’s grace, not Paul’s strength.

In today’s Gospel, Peter has a similar experience. He was a fisherman who knew his business and knew that some days, the fish just aren’t there. So when they caught enough fish to fill both boats, he realized that his pride was sinful. He was unworthy to receive such bounty from the Lord. And yet Jesus tells him that “you will be catching men” (Luke 5:10).

How many of us are like Peter and Paul, thinking we know just what our place in the world is, relying on our own strengths to do our jobs? They found Jesus calling them to a much more challenging life. Do we have the courage to listen to God’s call to serve?

#### **THEOPHANIES**

Today’s readings recount three theophanies, or particular manifestations of God’s presence. The prophet Isaiah is caught up in a dramatic scene of heavenly worship, with a royal throne, burning embers, and seraphim singing, “Holy, holy, holy.” Isaiah is overwhelmed. In the responsorial psalm, the assembly adds its own worship to that of the seraphim: “In the sight of the angels, I will sing your praises, Lord” (Psalm 138:1).

Paul reminds the Corinthians of his own experience of a post-Resurrection appearance of the Lord, making him an apostle, but one “born abnormally” (1 Corinthians 15:8), since he had no acquaintance with the earthly Jesus. The first of those who did know the earthly Jesus were surprised by fishing advice from the teacher who had commandeered Simon’s boat, resulting in an extraordinary catch. Although less colorful than those of Isaiah or Paul, this theophany was just as overwhelming. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

#### **TEOFANÍAS**

Las lecturas de hoy relatan tres teofanías, o manifestaciones de la presencia de Dios. El profeta Isaías se ve atrapado en una escena dramática de adoración celestial, con un trono real, brasas ardientes y serafines que cantan, “Santo, santo, santo”. Isaías está sobrecogido. En el salmo responsorial, la asamblea añade su propia adoración a la de los serafines: “A la vista de los ángeles, cantaré tus alabanzas, Señor” (Salmo 138:1).

Pablo recuerda a los corintios su propia experiencia de una aparición del Señor después de la resurrección, lo que lo hace un apóstol, pero “nacido de forma poco común” (1 corintios 15:8), ya que no conoció a Jesús de carne y hueso. Los primeros que sí conocieron a Jesús de carne y hueso se sorprendieron por los consejos de cómo pescar que les dio el maestro que había solicitado subir a la barca de Simón, y como consecuencia obtuvieron una pesca extraordinaria. Aunque menos pintoresca que la de Isaías o Pablo, esta teofanía fue igual de extraordinaria. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.



## St Joseph Cares

Our Parish council has proposed to establish a Catholic Family Fund .

Children are special gifts from God. It is the most holy privilege of parents to raise them for God, not for the world.

Our community has to support parents who raise their children in faith and love. They have to have regular family prayers and devotional practices akin to catholic traditions.

This fund is raised by depositing the offertory of the fifth weekend of any month. Requests are reviewed by a committee established by the pastoral council which makes recommendations to the Pastor who makes the decision.

Registered practicing catholic families of our parish who raise more than one child for God are eligible to apply. The family must be active in the liturgical and other spiritual activities of this parish. Exceptions are at the Pastor's discretion. Family may be required for a money management evaluation and a brief counseling for fiduciary responsibility if necessary. Either the Pastor or his delegate will do this session.

Funds may be requested for rent/mortgage, food, utilities, educational, medical or transportation needs.

Let us together build His Kingdom in our community.
