

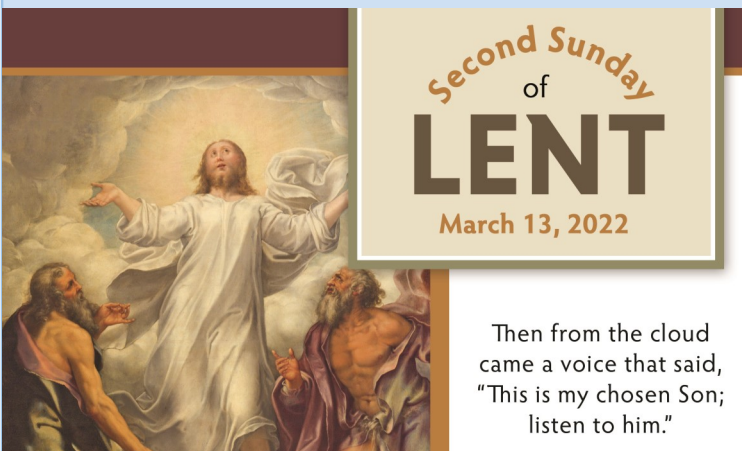

When St. Paul wrote to Romans that faith in the heart will lead to justification and proclamation on the lips to salvation he summarized our Lenten process.

Jesus came to bring salvation through His suffering, death and Resurrection thereby redeeming us from our slavish sinfulness.

First we have to be cleansed before being saved. So recognizing the process of how He accomplished it and feeling with His love for us is an inevitable step to qualify for this salvation.

The solemn renewal of this personal recognition of our unworthiness and a humble acceptance of His redeeming presence with us is the core of our Lenten spirituality. It is a personal experience which is celebrated with the family and the entire faith community. Basically Lent is the time of reinventing our personal intimacy with Jesus.

When we are filled with such an intense personal attachment to Jesus our words and actions will be witnesses to that. Communication of an experience becomes essential to the celebration. Proclamation on the lips through personal and communal devotions will lead to our salvation.

Let us take time to realize this renewal in our lives, with our family and with our faith community.

The story of the Transfiguration of Jesus in the Luke's Gospel this week is similar to the ones in Matthew and Mark. One difference I noticed in Luke's version is that Jesus does not tell the three disciples to keep it secret. It seems they decided on their own not to tell anyone.

One reason may be what they heard. While Matthew and Mark just say that Jesus spoke with Moses and Elijah, Luke is more specific: They "spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" (9:31). Jesus had just said that he would suffer, die, and be raised from the dead in Luke 9:22. They probably hoped he was just telling them the worst that could happen, not what really would happen. So hearing it from Moses and Elijah as well as from Jesus was too much for them.

This is where we come in. The apostles were afraid to face the coming passion and death of Jesus. I think we are like them in that we suffer more in anticipating what would hurt us than we do going through it. That is where faith can help. In faith, we hear Jesus tell us not to fear, as he often told his disciples. We know that Jesus suffered on the cross, so he knows what suffering is. And faith tells us that he is with us even when the suffering is the result of our own sins. After all, he himself suffered because of our sins. So have faith!

St Joseph Cares

Our Parish council has proposed to establish a Catholic Family Fund .

Children are special gifts from God. It is the most holy privilege of parents to raise them for God, not for the world.

Our community has to support parents who raise their children in faith and love. They have to have regular family prayers and devotional practices akin to catholic traditions.

This fund is raised by depositing the offertory of the fifth weekend of any month. Requests are reviewed by a committee established by the pastoral council which makes recommendations to the Pastor who makes the decision.

Registered practicing catholic families of our parish who raise more than one child for God are eligible to apply. The family must be active in the liturgical and other spiritual activities of this parish. Exceptions are at the Pastor's discretion. Family may be required for a money management evaluation and a brief counseling for fiduciary responsibility if necessary. Either the Pastor or his delegate will do this session.

Funds may be requested for rent/mortgage, food, utilities, educational, medical or transportation needs.

Let us together build His Kingdom in our community.
