According to this report praying is a losers game. In spiritual life there is a challenging principle that we win by losing. A very regularly praying and a devout lady was asked by a curious person about what did she gain due to her continuous prayers to God. The woman replied very humbly that she did not gain anything due to her regular prayers, instead she claimed that she had to deal with a lot of losses due to her regular prayers to God.

The following were few of her losses:

She claimed that due to her regular prayers she had a steady decline in her self grandiosity.

She had noticed that pride was waning steadily.

Greed was slowly disappearing.

Her quick temper and angry retorting nature is being lost.

My dirty cravings are disappearing.

Lost the joy of lying even for small talk.

The once relished taste for sin is lost.

My impatience and despair are lost.

In spite of all these losses, nobody can dissuade me from praying.

She gives us the secret philosophy of her prayer life: we pray often not to gain anything but to lose that which are obstacles to the growth of our spiritual life, for a strong bonding and a personal intimacy with God.

Prayer teaches us Prayer strengthens us Prayer heals us

Prayer is the Chanel that connects us directly with God. Thus prayer becomes the most cherished personal experience where we progressively make more space for God in our hearts and lives which has a transforming impact on our human behavior. We find joy to lose things that are not good for our spiritual life.

During the Lent we renew the habit of praying regularly, individually and as a family together. We encourage children to develop the habit of praying and thereby become better persons.

The book of Joshua tells of the Israelites coming into the Promised Land, where they no longer needed to be fed with manna as in the desert. They had been wandering much longer than expected because of their unfaithfulness. But now they are forgiven, and so celebrate the Passover with food from the land. Then we hear the Gospel parable about another feast. This one is also a celebration of forgiveness, for the prodigal son has returned to his father, and the father's forgiveness shows us how willing God is to forgive us. That's where we end the parable, right?

Wrong. The parable continues with the older son's complaint about a feast for his brother. That son cannot forgive his brother and is angry at the father for welcoming the prodigal back. This is where we come in. Most of us have no trouble asking God's forgiveness. But we may have trouble forgiving others. We are so used to thinking in terms of justice that we are not satisfied with forgiveness. When I have been hurt, I feel like hitting back.

So we have to ask ourselves whose idea of justice we live by. Is it the human expectation of an eye for an eye? Or is it God's justice, which is mercy and forgiveness? When someone cuts you off in traffic, do you feel like firing the photon torpedoes, or offering forgiveness? The Golden Rule could be "Forgive others as you would be forgiven." Jesus gave his life for the sins of the world. Do we have the right to ask for more?
