

From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

We are proud of our Catholic spiritual tradition. We look to the saints and mystics for role models and practical demonstrations on how to maintain a sense of holy on our spiritual journey. An awareness of a discipline, detachment from the liberal secularism and worldliness which will facilitate our growing intimacy with Jesus, and an intense longing for life eternal after this life, are all typical signs of our genuine spirituality.

This requires us to study and teach our children the major doctrines of our faith. These doctrines are derived from the Scriptures, the teachings of the Lord and organized by the teaching authority of the church which were translated into practices by saints and martyrs for generations. They are our models. It is imperative for us to study and review their spiritual journey.

Of course culture changes and cultural experiences vary. Every age cultural changes flourish feeding on liberal agenda of particular scenario. Whereas spiritual authenticity is based on orthodoxy. Adaptation is not an excuse for authenticity. It should not be editing but rather explaining in contemporary sociocultural milieu. The recent tendency of liberal editing compromises orthodoxy. Here we see text book companies compete for market share in faith formation. Goal is win by pleasing the crowd or treating the ring leaders. Books are packed with activities with barely enough time to finish them. If not processed and concluded kids do not get the core element. Such trend is not real faith formation though they call it so for complacency. It results in generations with no doctrinal insight into the true Catholicism. This makes the role of parents most important, as always. They should know the faith, teach kids about its importance and practice regularly. What they see is what they believe and live by. Certainly hearing may help the knowing process. Their frequent discussions, their devotions and regular prayer habits have the most lasting influence in children's lives, mostly when they are grown up and start reflecting on their childhood experiences, time when parents truly become influential role models.

As St Paul reminds us, leaving the past behind, making every effort for a Christ centered life focused on the future goal of being gathered into the glory of the Risen Lord in heaven is what makes us truly Catholic.

Estamos orgullosos de nuestra tradición espiritual Católica. Buscamos en los santos y místicos modelos a seguir y demostraciones prácticas sobre cómo mantener un sentido de santidad en nuestro viaje espiritual. La conciencia de una disciplina, el desapego del laicismo liberal y de la mundanalidad que facilitarán nuestra creciente intimidad con Jesús, y un intenso anhelo de vida eterna después de esta vida, son signos típicos de nuestra genuina espiritualidad.

Esto requiere que estudiemos y enseñemos a nuestros hijos las principales doctrinas de nuestra fe.

Estas doctrinas se derivan de las Escrituras, las enseñanzas del Señor y organizadas por la autoridad docente de la iglesia que fueron traducidas en prácticas por santos y mártires durante generaciones. Son nuestros modelos. Es imperativo para nosotros estudiar y revisar su viaje espiritual.

Por supuesto, los cambios culturales y las experiencias culturales varían. Cada época florecen los cambios culturales alimentándose de la agenda liberal de un escenario particular. Mientras que la autenticidad espiritual se basa en la ortodoxia. La adaptación no es una excusa para la autenticidad. No debe ser edición sino explicación en el medio sociocultural contemporáneo. La tendencia reciente de la edición liberal compromete la ortodoxia. Aquí vemos que las empresas de libros de texto compiten por una cuota de mercado en la formación en la fe. El objetivo es ganar complaciendo a la multitud o tratando a los líderes del ring. Los libros están repletos de actividades con apenas tiempo suficiente para terminarlas. Si no se procesa y concluye, los niños no obtienen el elemento central. Tal tendencia no es una verdadera formación en la fe, aunque lo llaman así por complacencia. Da como resultado generaciones sin una visión doctrinal del verdadero catolicismo. Esto hace que el papel de los padres sea el más importante, como siempre. Deben conocer la fe, enseñar a los niños sobre su importancia y practicarla regularmente. Lo que ven es lo que creen y viven. Ciertamente, escuchar puede ayudar al proceso de conocimiento. Sus conversaciones frecuentes, sus devociones y sus hábitos regulares de oración tienen la influencia más duradera en la vida de los niños, principalmente cuando crecen y comienzan a reflexionar sobre sus experiencias de la infancia, momento en que los padres se convierten verdaderamente en modelos influyentes a seguir.

Como nos recuerda san Pablo, dejar atrás el pasado, hacer todo lo posible por una vida centrada en Cristo y enfocada en la meta futura de ser reunidos en la gloria del Señor Resucitado en el cielo es lo que nos hace verdaderamente católicos.

In the long form of the Passion from Luke's Gospel, Jesus refers to himself as "the one who serves" (Luke 22:27). This reminds me of today's second reading from Paul's letter to the Philippians. He says that Christ "emptied himself, taking the form of a slave" (Philippians 2:7). Jesus is not just being humble here. He gives us an example of how far God will go in loving humanity.

I suspect the apostles were confused when Jesus talked this way. Yet he tells them to be like a servant—expect little reward for what you do for others. Now the apostles might have thought, "Sure, I can do that. I'll preach about the Kingdom of God for free. Then I'll really look important and holy." So Jesus reminds them that the world looks at the person being served as more important than the servant. But he is one who serves, and if the apostles are to be leaders of the church they will need to be servants, too. Why? Because that is how God comes to the people.

In the Passion according to Luke, Jesus heals one of the men sent to arrest him. Barabbas, a murderer, is set free so Jesus can be crucified. As he is led to the cross, he consoles the women who weep for him. And even on the cross, he is the suffering servant who asks the Father to forgive those who are killing him. With the example of service that Jesus shows toward those who put him to death, can we at least be "one who serves" those around us? Can we at least forgive those who hurt us—maybe even pray for our leaders, especially the ones with whom we disagree.



EL MENSAJE DE AMOR DE CRISTO

THE MESSAGE OF CHRIST'S LOVE

From the proclamation of the Gospel at the beginning of the liturgy, we know that today is different, not only because we hear two Gospel passages, or because we hold palms and move in procession. Today begins Holy Week, a time set apart, a week in which to listen, pray, reflect, and take to heart the truth of Christ's passion, crucifixion, death, and ultimately, resurrection. It takes a week, and a lifetime, to truly hear the message of Christ's love. It is difficult for us to comprehend that Jesus willingly sacrificed himself, so we must hear the story again and again. Let this week be for us a new moment of faith in which we, together with the criminal who was crucified with Christ, cry out, “Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.” Copyright © J. S. 
****Sacrament of Marriage** - Couples should contact the Pastor (336-629-0221) at least 6 months prior to the wedding date for necessary preparation.


