From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

For us Catholics Pentecost is not over just with a Vigil and a great Feast. It is an ongoing event and an abiding experience. At baptism we are given the Holy Spirit when we received the New Life as a child of God. The Holy Spirit is always in us. Many a time knowingly or unknowingly we can freeze this life of the Spirit in us. The Lord has given us sacraments through the Church for Revitalizing ourselves and abundant opportunities to become a new creation in the Spirit.

As we all know it is the Spirit who enables us to know and believe in the person of Jesus . The Spirit gives us courage to claim Him as our Lord and Savior and proclaim Him to the rest of the world against all the odds of life and the crushing adversities of an antagonist world out there. So the first sign of being alive in the Spirit is that we feel closer to Jesus always and frequently reflect on His love for us and His presence with us. We will have the confidence that we belong to Jesus. Another sign of being alive in the Spirit is that even when tortured by pounding frustrations and blinding excitements we will hold silent moments of prayerful reflection and feel connected with Jesus. A Spirit filled person will be compassionate. Compassion stems from a loving , caring, and forgiving heart. To forgive and let go and not to be bitter against those who crucified us, we need to be humble . Such humility is easier when we are alive in the Spirit. We get the energy to bridle our pride and let the love of the Lord prevail. This is very, very important in todays marriages. To be humble before your spouse , to prefer the feelings and sentiments of your spouse to your own self interests and grow in an abiding and exclusive intimacy with each other couples have to let the Holy Spirit energize their marriages.

Unfortunately today we are grieving the Holy Spirit through our yielding to the addictions of our time. This can be drugs, alcohol, social media, pornography, extramarital relations or out of wedlock relations. We are desensitized due to our overexposure to the anti Christian agenda of the liberal media . We tend to take such issues lightly and ignore the sense of guilt.

The Spirit enables us to repent, reconcile with the Lord, and restore the state of grace in us. At His final session with the disciples Jesus greeted “peace be with you “ and breathed on them His Spirit. To receive His Peace and to live in His Peace, we have to receive His Spirit as well . We must be alert not to smother the promptings of the Holy Spirit in us. We must train our children to always pray to the Holy Spirit.

Para nosotros, los católicos, Pentecostés no termina solo con una Vigilia y una gran Fiesta. Es un evento continuo y una experiencia duradera. En el bautismo se nos da el Espíritu Santo cuando recibimos la Vida Nueva como hijos de Dios. El Espíritu Santo está siempre en nosotros. Muchas veces, a sabiendas o sin saberlo, podemos congelar esta vida del Espíritu en nosotros. El Señor nos ha dado sacramentos a través de la Iglesia para revitalizarnos y abundantes oportunidades para convertirnos en una nueva creación en el Espíritu.

Como todos sabemos, es el Espíritu quien nos permite conocer y creer en la persona de Jesús. El Espíritu nos da valor para reclamarlo como nuestro Señor y Salvador y proclamarlo al resto del mundo contra todas las adversidades de la vida y las abrumadoras adversidades de un mundo antagonista allá afuera. Entonces, la primera señal de estar vivos en el Espíritu es sentirnos más cerca de Jesús siempre y reflexionar frecuentemente sobre su amor por nosotros y su presencia con nosotros. Tendremos la confianza de que pertenecemos a Jesús.

Otra señal de estar vivos en el Espíritu es que incluso cuando estamos torturados por frustraciones palpitantes y emociones cegadoras, mantendremos momentos silenciosos de reflexión en oración y nos sentiremos conectados con Jesús. Una persona llena del Espíritu será compasiva. La compasión surge de un corazón que ama, se preocupa y perdona. Para perdonar y soltar y no amargarnos con los que nos crucificaron, necesitamos ser humildes. Tal humildad es más fácil cuando estamos vivos en el Espíritu. Obtenemos la energía para refrenar nuestro orgullo y dejar que prevalezca el amor del Señor. Esto es muy, muy importante en los matrimonios de hoy. Para ser humilde ante su cónyuge, para preferir los sentimientos y sentimientos de su cónyuge a sus propios intereses y crecer en una intimidad permanente y exclusiva entre sí, las parejas deben dejar que el Espíritu Santo energice sus matrimonios.

Desafortunadamente, hoy en día estamos entristeciendo al Espíritu Santo al ceder a las adicciones de nuestro tiempo. Esto puede ser drogas, alcohol, redes sociales, pornografía, relaciones extramatrimoniales o relaciones fuera del matrimonio. Estamos insensibilizados debido a nuestra sobreexposición a la agenda anticristiana de los medios liberales. Tendemos a tomar estos temas a la ligera e ignorar el sentimiento de culpa. El Espíritu nos permite arrepentirnos, reconciliarnos con el Señor y restaurar el estado de gracia en nosotros. En su última sesión con los discípulos, Jesús les dijo “la paz sea con vosotros” y sopló sobre ellos su Espíritu. Para recibir Su Paz y vivir en Su Paz, también tenemos que recibir Su Espíritu. Debemos estar alerta para no sofocar los impulsos del Espíritu Santo en nosotros. Debemos entrenar a nuestros hijos a orar siempre al Espíritu Santo.

As if his own life, his teachings about God's love, his miracles, his death and resurrection were not enough, Jesus told us something about God that we never would have imagined: There are three Persons in one God. It is also something we cannot completely comprehend. So instead of trying to explain it, let's look at what it means for us believers.

One thing it shows is that God wants to be known by us. In ancient times, people would expect their gods to be mysterious and hidden. Many cultures thought that you could control a spirit or god if you knew its name. God sees us not as a threat, but as beloved children. Just as a couple falling in love wants to know everything about each other, so God wants to be known by those whom God loves. That leads to my second point.

The Trinity also shows us that "God is love" (1 John 4:16) because the three Persons are united in one God. God calls us to be united in love with God and with each other. Remember that God knows us perfectly and still loves us. Yet knowing our weaknesses and our sins does not hurt God's love for us. On the contrary, our weaknesses allow God to help us by forgiving sins, or inspiring someone to come to our assistance.

We may not be able to grasp the full meaning of the Holy Trinity, but knowing that God shares this with faithful people helps us to love God even more.

RAÍCES BÍBLICAS DE LA TRINIDAD

Las lecturas de hoy muestran algunas raíces bíblicas de lo que los cristianos llamarían más adelante la Trinidad. El libro de los Proverbios muestra el papel de la Sabiduría en la obra de la creación, descrita como una realidad ajena a Dios, pero integrada en la obra de Dios de formar los cielos y la tierra. Nos unimos al salmista para compartir el deleite de la Sabiduría en la obra de Dios: “Oh Señor, nuestro Dios, qué maravilloso es tu nombre en toda la tierra” (Salmo 8:2). En su carta a los romanos, Pablo escribe sobre la paz con Dios por medio de Jesús, y el amor de Dios que se recibe por medio del Espíritu Santo, lo que distingue a Dios, a Jesús y al Espíritu Santo, aunque también muestran su permanente unidad. Por último, en el discurso de despedida del Evangelio de Juan, Jesús -que antes había hablado de sí mismo como el Hijo del Padre- promete a sus amigos que recibirán el Espíritu de la verdad que les enseñará y guiará después de que él se vaya. BIBLICAL ROOTS OF THE TRINITY

Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: “O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth” (Psalm 8:2). In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father—promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure. 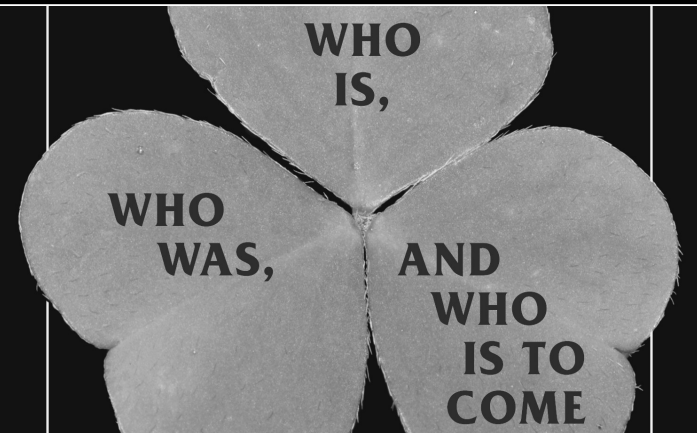

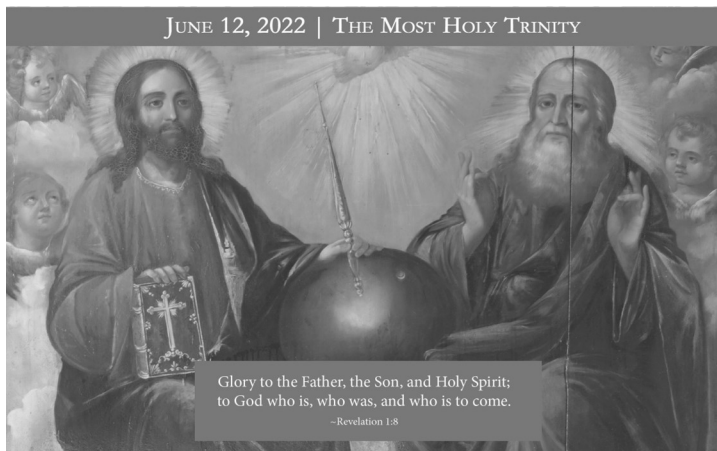
