From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

In the liturgical cycle of our faith celebrations now we are in the Ordinary time. Readings and reflections keep our focus on the public Ministry of Jesus . In the early part we see Jesus calling disciples to follow Him.

He trained them and sent them out to prepare the people to welcome Him. Those who loved Jesus responded to this call and became His Apostles.

So discipleship journey is being realized by becoming apostles of Jesus. For that we must first love Jesus. We have to listen to His Words and learn from Him. Filled with His love and strengthened by the power of His Word we are empowered to become His Apostles today.

As Catholics we are all Apostles of Jesus.
There are several characteristics typical of our Catholic tradition.

Through our devotion to the Lord nourished by the celebration of the Holy Eucharist and the study of the scriptures our life becomes Christ-centered. We are constantly guided by His teachings . Our morality urges us to abstain from immoral trends of the world like pornography, immoral sexuality, abortion, marital infidelity etc. we believe in the sanctity of life in all its nuances.

To maintain our sense of holy and be filled with the joy of His presence in us, we have devotional practices like, adoration of the Lord in the most holy Eucharist, rosary, novenas and consecrations, Bible study groups, retreats and prayer groups. Many of these can be individual or in groups. Celebration of sacraments, especially the daily holy Mass, are unique to the catholic spirituality. We are pilgrims on earth marching towards our eternal home in heaven. Maintaining our communion with the Lord and abstaining from the evil influences of the world we continue this journey with the intense of hope of receiving our salvation into His Glory.

We have to discuss with our children frequently about this catholic uniqueness of our life.

En el ciclo litúrgico de nuestras celebraciones de fe ahora estamos en el tiempo Ordinario. Las lecturas y reflexiones mantienen nuestro enfoque en el Ministerio público de Jesús. En la primera parte vemos a Jesús llamando a los discípulos a seguirlo. Él los entrenó y los envió a preparar a la gente para recibirlo. Los que amaban a Jesús respondieron a este llamado y se convirtieron en Sus Apóstoles.

Entonces, el camino del discipulado se está realizando convirtiéndose en apóstoles de Jesús. Para eso primero debemos amar a Jesús. Tenemos que escuchar Sus Palabras y aprender de Él. Llenos de Su amor y fortalecidos por el poder de Su Palabra, estamos capacitados para convertirnos en Sus Apóstoles hoy.

Como católicos, todos somos apóstoles de Jesús. Hay varias características típicas de nuestra tradición católica. A través de nuestra devoción al Señor, alimentada por la celebración de la Sagrada Eucaristía y el estudio de las Escrituras, nuestra vida se vuelve cristocéntrica. Estamos constantemente guiados por sus enseñanzas. Nuestra moralidad nos insta a abstenernos de las tendencias inmorales del mundo como la pornografía, la sexualidad inmoral, el aborto, la infidelidad conyugal, etc. Creemos en la santidad de la vida en todos sus matices.

Para mantener nuestro sentido de santidad y llenarnos del gozo de Su presencia en nosotros, tenemos prácticas devocionales como, adoración del Señor en la santísima Eucaristía, rosario, novenas y consagraciones, grupos de estudio bíblico, retiros y grupos de oración. Muchos de estos pueden ser individuales o en grupos. La celebración de los sacramentos, especialmente la santa Misa diaria, son propios de la espiritualidad católica. Somos peregrinos en la tierra marchando hacia nuestro hogar eterno en el cielo. Manteniendo nuestra comunión con el Señor y absteniéndonos de las malas influencias del mundo continuamos este camino con la intensa esperanza de recibir nuestra salvación en Su Gloria.

Tenemos que discutir con nuestros hijos frecuentemente sobre esta singularidad católica de nuestra vida. Dios los bendiga a todos

There seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy?

The readings make clear that it is not a result of our efforts. Isaiah writes that "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons, but "because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.

Does that sound like false humility? No; when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. Instead of being discouraged when we seem to fail, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

St. Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made, or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work, or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice.

LA BUENA NUEVA ESTÁ EN CAMINO

Esta semana, en pleno verano, las Escrituras nos dan la bienvenida con alegría, paz, misericordia y más paz. Suena un poco como a Adviento ¿cierto? Con frecuencia asociamos al profeta Isaías con ese tiempo de preparación, y nuestra primera lectura suena con palabras como regocijar, consolar y alegrarse. Los israelitas tenían motivos para alegrarse, pues habían regresado, vuelto a casa, a una Jerusalén reconstruida tras su exilio en Babilonia.

En el Evangelio, los setenta y dos discípulos que habían sido enviados tienen su propio “regreso a casa”, volviendo a Jesús después de haber difundido la Buena Nueva del Reino y en haber preparado a la gente para el “advenimiento” de Jesús a sus ciudades y pueblos en su largo camino a Jerusalén. Como los exiliados que comenta Isaías, los discípulos regresan regocijados.

La Buena Nueva, el Reino de Dios, está llegando, incluso en el verano. Como nos recuerda el salmo de hoy: “¡Grite con alegría a Dios toda la tierra!” Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.


PRAYER OF THE WEEK

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GOOD NEWS IS ON THE WAY

This week, in the midst of summer, the scriptures greet us with joy, peace, mercy, and more peace! Sounds a little like Advent, doesn't it? We often associate the prophet Isaiah with that preparatory season, and our first reading rings with such words as exult, comfort, and rejoice. The Israelites had reason to rejoice, for they had returned, come home, to a rebuilt Jerusalem from their exile in Babylon.

In the Gospel, the seventy-two disciples who were sent out have their own “homecoming,” returning to Jesus from spreading the Good News of the Kingdom and preparing people for the “advent” of Jesus into their cities and towns on his long road to Jerusalem. Like the exiles in Isaiah, the disciples return rejoicing.

The Good News, the Kingdom of God, is coming, even in summer. As today's psalm reminds us, “Shout joyfully to God, all the earth!” Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.
