



## From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

When Apostle Paul said that God has revealed the mystery, hidden for generations, but revealed to all now, the mystery of Christ in us, our hope of salvation, he was reminding us of this great privilege and challenging us to realize its impact on our faith journey.

There are several requirements to grow to this level of spirituality. First of all we have to believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. He confines Himself Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, the totality of His Person into the Host for my sake, to facilitate my faith in the possibility of His coming to me. Each time I participate in the celebration there is a conscious renewal of my faith .

Here comes the problem: thoughts like I am unworthy, my faith is weak, I am sinful etc will dissuade us. Here we hold on to Him. It is His Mercy that makes this happen and we become humble and grateful. That is why we seek His forgiveness before the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

This humility and our faith in Him generates a longing for Him . This attitude helps us bring all our attention on Jesus during the celebration. It is not my eligibility or qualifications that matters but His Mercy and personal love for me. This is the source of the Joy of the Eucharistic experience.

After Holy Communion we can feel Him and be filled with His presence in us . Definitely we have to have a moment of thanksgiving and adoration.

This mystery of Jesus in us is the secret of our catholic faith journey. It implies awareness, faith , humility, and total personal availability.

We have remind ourselves of this process and educate our children on how to have such experience through constant practices. Once they get an insight into this they will not complain about going to Mass. once they know that this mystery will generate in us a longing for eternal life, they will be all the more interested in having a Christ-centered faith journey.

Cuando el Apóstol Pablo dijo que Dios ha revelado el misterio, escondido por generaciones, pero revelado ahora a todos, el misterio de Cristo en nosotros, nuestra esperanza de salvación, nos estaba recordando este gran privilegio y desafiándonos a darnos cuenta de su impacto en nuestro viaje de fe.

Hay varios requisitos para crecer a este nivel de espiritualidad. Ante todo tenemos que creer en la presencia real de Jesús en la Sagrada Eucaristía. Se encierra en Cuerpo y Sangre, Alma y Divinidad, la totalidad de Su Persona en la Hostia por mí, para facilitar mi fe en la posibilidad de Su venida a mí. Cada vez que participo en la celebración hay una renovación consciente de mi fe.

Aquí viene el problema: pensamientos como que soy indigno, mi fe es débil, soy pecador, etc. nos disuadirán. Aquí nos aferramos a Él. Es Su Misericordia la que hace que esto suceda y nos volvemos humildes y agradecidos. Por eso buscamos Su perdón antes de la celebración de la Sagrada Eucaristía.

Esta humildad y nuestra fe en Él genera un anhelo por Él. Esta actitud nos ayuda a poner toda nuestra atención en Jesús durante la celebración. No es mi elegibilidad o calificaciones lo que importa sino Su Misericordia y amor personal por mí. Esta es la fuente de la alegría de la experiencia eucarística.

Después de la Sagrada Comunión podemos sentirlo y ser llenos de Su presencia en nosotros. Definitivamente tenemos que tener un momento de acción de gracias y adoración. Este misterio de Jesús en nosotros es el secreto de nuestro camino de fe católica. Implica conciencia, fe, humildad y total disponibilidad personal.

Tenemos que recordarnos a nosotros mismos este proceso y educar a nuestros hijos sobre cómo tener esa experiencia a través de prácticas constantes. Una vez que comprendan esto, no se quejarán de ir a Misa. Una vez que sepan que este misterio generará en nosotros un anhelo de vida eterna, estarán más interesados en tener un camino de fe centrado en Cristo.

Jesus talks about praying for whatever we need with faith and confidence, but he ends by asking,


"How much more with the Father . . . give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 1:13). Is he saying there are limits to what we can ask for?

"Be careful what you ask for," the saying warns. Just because we want something doesn't mean it will be good for us. But if we have enough faith to pray for something, we probably would not pray for anything evil. So what is Jesus really saying? He is giving us two lessons about prayer.

First, he assures us that God does hear our prayers and answers them. Many people take "ask and you shall receive" so literally that they expect God to do their bidding no matter what they want. But God is free to do what is best for us, free to answer some prayers with a no when what we seek is against God's will. So maybe our first prayer should be to ask God to show us what we really need.

That leads us to the second lesson: prayer changes us, not God. If we truly pray as Jesus prayed, we would say, "Not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39). It's not easy to change our minds about what we want or need. To change our desires from selfish to holy takes a lot of power, the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was raised from the dead by that power and we will be, too (Romans 8:11). So when Jesus promises that the Father will give the Spirit to us for asking, the Spirit is both the source of and the answer to our prayers. Let us ask the Spirit to empower us to desire and pray for what we really need.

## **UNA CONVERSACIÓN CON DIOS**

Este fin de semana ponemos nuestra atención en la oración. En el Evangelio, Jesús da a sus discípulos, y a nosotros, la oración del Padre Nuestro, que durante siglos hemos apreciado. Las dos primeras palabras abarcan mucho de nuestra fe: la unidad entre todos los cristianos (Nuestro), y un sentido de que estamos en una relación profundamente vinculada con Dios (Padre).

En el libro de Génesis, vemos a Abraham en una oración de conversación, en su humildad de criatura ante su Creador, buscando misericordia y compasión por un inocente. El salmo es una oración poética de agradecimiento y alabanza al Dios que respondió a las oraciones sinceras de un pueblo que había pedido ayuda, mostrando su misericordia. En el Evangelio de Lucas, los discípulos quieren orar como Jesús, con la misma intimidad, para experimentar a Dios como Abba en lo más profundo de su ser.

## PRAYER OF THE WEEK

### **Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

#### **Reflection question:**

In what ways can I use the good things of this world without clinging to them?

## **CONVERSATION WITH GOD**

Prayer is our focus this weekend. In the Gospel, Jesus gives his disciples, and us, the Lord's Prayer, which we have cherished through the centuries. The first two words encompass much about our faith—unity among all Christians (Our), and a sense that we are in a deeply bonded relationship with God (Father).

In Genesis, we see Abraham in conversational prayer, in his creaturely humility before his Creator, seeking mercy and compassion for the innocent. The psalm is a lyrical prayer of thanksgiving and praise for the God who answered the sincere prayers of a people who had called out for help, showing them mercy. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples want to pray like Jesus, with the same intimacy—to experience God as Abba in the depths of their being.




