From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

It is very important for us to recognize the role of daily family prayer in our homes.

Without prayer we are losing our catholic culture and traditions. There are several reasons to restore family prayer. Praying together the family members feel closer to each other. A sense of family and a personal attachment to one another are established when pray together. It will strengthen our sense of belonging to God and will improve our faith and spiritual interest.

When we don't pray usually we see that time is substituted with worldly activities like tv programs or social media addictions. Such occupations make us more individualistic and independent of each other. Eventually the spirit of family unity will be disappearing. Prayerful family will raise children who respect and appreciate parents because they will be grateful to God and in turn respectful to the parents. Prayer and devotions help appealing personality development for children. It creates the atmosphere of being together and more tolerant to each other which will enhance their excellent interpersonal dynamics that are essential for their professional success in the future.

Another extremely important benefit of family prayer is it's role in protecting our marriages.

When we pray our heart will be filled with grace from God. Gratitude and humility are two values resulting from receiving grace. Dark and negative energy resulting from our arrogance and bitterness will be displaced with joy and peace that comes from God. We become humble and willing to forgive each other and be reconciled. Many of our marriages fail due to the inability to forgive and reconcile. When we forgive we love and when we love we forgive. Genuine marital intimacy is grounded on humble and forgiving hearts.

We need God's grace for this .

True and lasting pursuit of happiness is spiritual. Entertainments, economic achievements and worldly excitements are momentary and do not guarantee lasting peace and joy in life. The grace we receive through prayerful spiritual connection with God will help us to have fulfilling intimacy and attachment in our marriages and homes.

We must train and raise our children in such family of prayer. It is very true now that a family that prays together and eats together stays together.


The second reading from the Letter to the Colossians goes well with the first reading and the Gospel. Those passages warn how useless material wealth will be when we die. St. Paul continues this warning by reminding us that we have already died with Christ in baptism and risen to new life. To live this new life we must put to death whatever tendencies keep us from Christ.

Wealth can be a gift from God. The abuse is not necessarily in the possession of wealth. More likely, we abuse wealth in the way we attain it. How does that happen? I can give an obvious answer such as robbing a bank. Instead, do I work a full day for my pay, or do I spend a lot of time visiting with other employees or texting my friends? Am I honest with my customers, charging only for work I have done?

As for using our wealth, we usually think of family first. Do we spoil our kids, so they can "have the things I couldn't afford when I was young"? Or do we teach them to work for what they get? Do we teach our children to be generous to others?

Notice that Paul goes deeper, pointing out the thoughts and desires that lead to a life centered in wealth. In baptism we put to death passion and greed, tendencies that push us to own more or to control another person. Paul uses the image of taking off these vices as if they were clothing and putting on a new self that shows Christ in us. We begin to see Christ in others, for as Paul says, "Christ is all and in all" (Colossians 3:11).

In Colossians, faith in the crucified and resurrected Christ is proclaimed as the path to a richly purposeful and meaningful life. The path of Christian faith places our work, our sufferings, and our limitations within the larger picture of God's purposes for all of us. In Jesus, God is revealed as our companion in human suffering and limitation. God's love is at the center of a meaningful life. 
