From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

New school year has arrived. Parents and children are preoccupied with back to school chores and shopping. The general tendency for both groups is to get exhausted with expectations and expenses. It is important to reflect on the role and responsibilities of both.

Three concerns are worth consideration. They are desire, self confidence, and hope.

Children should have desire to go to school. Parents and children discuss, which school to go, why they are going to school, what are they going to do there, what to expect and how to respond to what happens there, what are the responsibilities to be successful, how important is the success for future etc. Such discussions will accelerate their desire to go to school and make them feel personally responsible for success.

Parents accelerate this desire and responsibility with generous cooperation and reinforce it through frequent evaluations and reviews. With clear purpose and motivation children will carefully avoid pervasive and distracting deviant influences.

Second important factor is self confidence. Once the goal is set, parents should time and time again reinforce their self confidence through continuous involvement with their student life. Parental participation or absence plays a major role in their staying focused leading to success. Frequent family dialogues on school activities make children feel the backing of the family and an assurance that, "I can do it".

With desire and confidence comes the hope to finish the school year joyously. Firstly parents should have hope that their kids will succeed and communicate that with them. If the parents are frequently involved in their children's school antisocial elements cannot disrupt their progress. Positively dealing with success and failures will facilitate the spirit of perseverance in children. Discuss with children the role and importance of prayer for genuine desire, courageous confidence and sure hope in success.

Ha llegado el nuevo año escolar. Los padres y los niños están preocupados por las tareas escolares y las compras. La tendencia general de ambos grupos es agotarse con las expectativas y los gastos. Es importante reflexionar sobre el papel y las responsabilidades de ambos.

Vale la pena considerar tres preocupaciones. Son el deseo, la confianza en uno mismo y la esperanza.

Los niños deben tener ganas de ir a la escuela. Los padres y los niños discuten a qué escuela ir, por qué van a la escuela, qué van a hacer allí, qué esperar y cómo responder a lo que sucede allí, cuáles son las responsabilidades para tener éxito, qué tan importante es el éxito, para el futuro, etc. Tales discusiones acelerarán su deseo de ir a la escuela y los harán sentir personalmente responsables del éxito.

Los padres aceleran este deseo y responsabilidad con una cooperación generosa y lo refuerzan mediante evaluaciones y revisiones frecuentes. Con un propósito y una motivación claros, los niños evitarán cuidadosamente las influencias desviadas dominantes y que distraen.

El segundo factor importante es la confianza en uno mismo. Una vez que se establece la meta, los padres deben reforzar su confianza en sí mismos una y otra vez a través de una participación continua en su vida estudiantil. La participación o ausencia de los padres juega un papel importante para que se mantengan enfocados y conduzcan al éxito. Los frecuentes diálogos familiares sobre las actividades escolares hacen que los niños sientan el respaldo de la familia y la seguridad de que "yo puedo".

Con ganas y confianza llega la esperanza de terminar el año escolar con alegría. En primer lugar, los padres deben tener la esperanza de que sus hijos tengan éxito y comunicárselo. Si los padres se involucran con frecuencia en la escuela de sus hijos, los elementos antisociales no pueden interrumpir su progreso. Abordar positivamente los éxitos y los fracasos facilitará el espíritu de perseverancia en los niños. Discuta con los niños el papel y la importancia de la oración por el deseo genuino, la confianza valiente y la esperanza segura en el éxito.

The common theme of today's readings is forgiveness.

The Gospel is one familiar to us all, and Paul in the second reading highlights his story of receiving God's mercy. But the first reading might cause us to wonder if God was always so forgiving. God and Moses come across like a couple of parents deciding whether they should punish their children. One, the Lord, points out how bad Israel has been. The other, Moses, points out how good God is, in the promise to make them a great nation. The important point is that God relented and forgave the people.

In each case, great sins are forgiven—not because the people deserved it, but because they were loved.

My favorite line in the second reading is "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"

(1Timothy 1:15)—not to find the wealthiest people to build his kingdom, or the nicest, or the holiest; he came to save sinners. The Pharisees and scribes did not get this. That was one of the reasons they wanted to kill Jesus. And yet, when they did just that, Jesus' death on the cross brought forgiveness for us all.

Remember the story in Genesis 18, of Abraham bargaining with God not to destroy Sodom if he could find a few good people? Maybe he should have "reminded" God of that divine mercy instead of hoping to find enough good people to spare the town.

Sometimes we can't believe that God would love us so much as to forgive any sin. Just look at the cross if you need a reminder.




The Seven Promises of the Seven Sorrows Devotion
