From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

When we read about the martyrdom experience of the Maccabee brothers from the Old Testament, it is challenging our life and attitudes to life. Two fears are scary for all of us: fear of death and fear of the unknown after death. To deal with the fear of death we need to have a strong faith in the Lord who gave us this life and whom we hope to encounter after this life. It is easy for us to think that God gave us this life and He takes it back when He chooses.

When we have very little say about these two facts about our life where does the fear come from. We tend to cling to all that this life gives us to the extent that we conveniently forget that God has a plan for us when He gave us life. This independent attitude promotes our indulgence in worldliness that is pleasing to our pleasures while ignoring what is pleasing to God. The resultant alienation hardens our hearts sometimes to the level of questioning or even denying God. The lurking insecurity at the back of our minds is frightening when we realize that our control on life is slipping out of our hands.

Here people of faith find peace of mind. Faith opens our eyes. Then we will not desire, after this life, what this world is offering but what God is promising. That is when the longing for being gathered into His Glory awakens in us.

Such a strong faith will extinguish the all consuming fire of the fear of death. It is through our faith in God and a stronger trust in His promises that we overcome the fear of death. It is such a hope in God's promise of Resurrection that strengthened the Maccabee brothers. It was their mother who reinforced that faith.

Faith in God and His promise of eternal life will positively influence our fear of death and fear of the unknown after this life. Our devotion to God through Jesus and our faith in His teachings through the scriptures become very relevant and positively rewarding. Parents, especially mothers have to teach children to believe in Resurrection and to have strong faith in God. Be not afraid. Live in communion with God through Jesus. Your reward in heaven will be great. God bless you all

Cuando leemos sobre la experiencia del martirio de los hermanos Macabeos del Antiguo Testamento, está desafiando nuestra vida y nuestras actitudes ante la vida. Dos miedos nos asustan a todos: el miedo a la muerte y el miedo a lo desconocido después de la muerte. Para lidiar con el miedo a la muerte necesitamos tener fe fuerte en el Señor que nos dio esta vida y a quien esperamos encontrar después de esta vida. Es fácil para nosotros pensar que Dios nos dio esta vida y nos la quita cuando Él quiere.

Cuando tenemos muy poco que decir sobre estos dos hechos de nuestra vida, ¿de dónde viene el miedo? Tendemos a aferrarnos a todo lo que esta vida nos da al punto que olvidamos convenientemente que Dios tiene un plan para nosotros cuando nos dio la vida. Esta actitud independiente promueve nuestra indulgencia en la mundanalidad que agrada a nuestros placeres mientras ignoramos lo que agrada a Dios. La alienación resultante endurece nuestros corazones a veces al nivel de cuestionar o incluso negar a Dios. La inseguridad que acecha en el fondo de nuestras mentes es aterradora cuando nos damos cuenta de que nuestro control sobre la vida se nos está escapando de las manos.

Aquí la gente de fe encuentra paz. La fe abre nuestros ojos. Entonces no desearemos, después de esta vida, lo que este mundo ofrece sino lo que Dios promete. Es entonces cuando se despierta en nosotros el anhelo de ser reunidos en Su Gloria. Una fe tan fuerte extinguirá el fuego que todo lo consume del miedo a la muerte. Es a través de nuestra fe en Dios y una mayor confianza en sus promesas que vencemos el miedo a la muerte. Es tal esperanza en la promesa de Dios de la Resurrección que fortaleció a los hermanos Macabeos. Fue su madre quien reforzó esa fe.

La fe en Dios y Su promesa de vida eterna influirá positivamente en nuestro miedo a la muerte ya lo desconocido después de esta vida. Nuestra devoción a Dios a través de Jesús y nuestra fe en Sus enseñanzas a través de las Escrituras se vuelven muy relevantes y positivamente gratificantes. Los padres, especialmente las madres, tienen que enseñar a los niños a creer en la Resurrección ya tener una fe fuerte en Dios. No tengas miedo. Vivir en comunión con Dios a través de Jesús. Su recompensa en el cielo será grande. Dios los bendiga a todos

When Jesus rose from the dead, he showed his disciples that even death will be overcome by God. In today's Gospel, he expands that to include most of the bad things that can happen to both non-believers and disciples alike.

Starting with the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem, Jesus mentions most of the scary things that people thought would bring the end of the world. He gives two pieces of advice. First, don't be fooled by anyone who says this is the end or who claims to be Jesus. When Jesus comes again, there will be no doubt about who it is. Then, don't be terrified by natural disasters or wars.

As disciples, we hope we would respond to disasters not with fear, but with love. Believers can voluntarily help those affected, comfort the survivors, or help rebuild their homes or schools. People have welcomed strangers into their homes after a flood or hurricane has destroyed a neighborhood.

There is a saying that "no good deed goes unpunished." Jesus never says that his disciples would be given awards for their acts of charity. In the second half of the Gospel, he says that his disciples would be persecuted, hated, and even betrayed by their own families. Jesus has advice for that situation, too. He tells us "not to prepare your defense," but to let him give us the words. I suspect that he means not to worry about what you might say, lest you become scared speechless. If you let him, Jesus will "prepare" you with the scripture readings, your pastor's homilies, and your own prayer life. All of these can help open us to the gifts of the Spirit, who helps us proclaim our faith without fear.

THE END OF DAYS


As we prepare for next Sunday's feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we hear descriptions of dire and catastrophic events. Sometimes it seems as though we ourselves are living in the end times, when life as we currently know it will cease for everyone. In answer to what must have been a fearful question, Jesus does not sugarcoat his foretelling of future days. Nor does the Old Testament prophet Malachi flinch from his pronouncements upon an evil world. Saint Paul, still writing to the Thessalonians, warns them prophetically against succumbing to "The End Is Near" syndrome—indolence in the face of the final days. However, both Jesus and Malachi speak of the recompense for living a just life—healing and vindication. 


