From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

As we have embarked on the celebration of Advent with all its immensity and honesty it is worth considering certain personal and family dynamics that are vital to this season.

Unlike Lent when the focus is on repentance, renewal and refocusing our faith journey this season is more exciting and exuberant in nature. But we have to be careful not to be carried away with the commercial pressures of the business world that seek to exploit the jubilant mood of believers.

The success of both seasons is based on increasing our personal intimacy with Jesus and embracing activities and devotions that will enhance our personal commitment to Him and His Kingdom.

Advent is the time of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's coming - the historic coming in the past, the ongoing coming in the here and now, and the final coming in His Glory . These three realities combined together stimulate the faith experience of every believer that intensifies the Joy of the Lord's Love in our hearts.

We notice that all songs and prayers are mostly, "come Lord Jesus come " . We are not asking Him to come into this crazy world again ! We are praying for His coming into our hearts and lives. The result will be an experience of the Kingdom of God restored in our lives, our families, and our communities. We become better children of God, genuine disciples of the Lord, and true followers of Jesus. It is easy said than done. We must guard ourselves and our children against the intrusive liberal agenda of the social media .

As a community of faith we maintain our true focus in our liturgical celebrations and activities. As families of faith , all members gather together every day , recite common prayers of the day, read relevant portions from the Bible, pray and sing together and fill the house with the Joy of the Lord's love. As individuals, maintain the awareness of the season throughout the day, frequently recite prayers of intimacy with Jesus, repeat songs of devotion to Jesus, and at the end of the day share with family during family time how your devotion improved your stronger attachment with Jesus. If you are true to these steps at the end of Advent you will feel what it means to greet one another "Merry Christmas " .

Parents have to encourage all children to have a personal experience of this joyous Advent.

A diferencia de la Cuaresma, cuando el enfoque está en el arrepentimiento, la renovación y el reenfoque de nuestro viaje de fe, esta temporada es más emocionante y exuberante por naturaleza. Pero debemos tener cuidado de no dejarnos llevar por las presiones comerciales del mundo de los negocios que buscan explotar el estado de ánimo jubiloso de los creyentes.

El éxito de ambas temporadas se basa en aumentar nuestra intimidad personal con Jesús y abrazar actividades y devociones que mejoren nuestro compromiso personal con Él y Su Reino.

El Adviento es el tiempo de preparación para la celebración de la venida del Señor: la venida histórica en el pasado, la venida continua en el aquí y ahora, y la venida final en Su gloria. Estas tres realidades combinadas estimulan la experiencia de fe de cada creyente que intensifica la Alegría del Amor del Señor en nuestros corazones.

Notamos que todas las canciones y oraciones son en su mayoría, "ven Señor Jesús, ven". ¡No le estamos pidiendo que vuelva a este mundo loco! Estamos orando por Su venida a nuestros corazones y vidas. El resultado será una experiencia del Reino de Dios restaurado en

nuestras vidas, nuestras familias y nuestras comunidades. Nos convertimos en mejores hijos de Dios, verdaderos discípulos del Señor y verdaderos seguidores de Jesús. Es fácil decirlo que hacerlo. Debemos protegernos a nosotros mismos ya nuestros hijos de la intrusiva agenda liberal de las redes sociales.

Como comunidad de fe, mantenemos nuestro verdadero enfoque en nuestras celebraciones y actividades litúrgicas. Part of Isaiah's hopeful description of the Messiah contains the traditional seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of the Messiah, and looking forward to his coming in glory, let us take a look at those gifts and see how we can use them.

Wisdom is the gift of seeing God in creation. It means that we value the things of this world only as they help us to know and love God more. The second gift, understanding, follows from wisdom. We understand what God expects of us in dealing with creation and other people. This gift helps us know how to act in a world that seems to ignore God. Counsel follows from understanding as the gift of making correct judgments on how to act. For example, understanding can lead us to love others; counsel guides us to love them in appropriate ways.

Strength, or fortitude, is the gift that enables us to do those things inspired by understanding and counsel, even if they are difficult. John the Baptist displays that gift in the Gospel. Fortitude gave him the courage to die for his faith. Knowledge is similar to counsel in that we begin to see what God wants for us in this world.

Knowledge leads us to deeper revelations of the truths of our faith. This can lead to the sixth gift, piety (seventh in Isaiah's text—"delight in the Lord"), a willingness to worship and love God, a desire to be close to God in prayer. The final gift, fear of the Lord, is the awe and wonder of recognizing how great God is, how much God loves us, and how much we want to stay close to God. And the desire to be close to God circles back to the wisdom with which we see God in creation.

OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Immaculate Conception (December 8)

December 8 we celebrate the patronal solemnity of the United States and the greatest of Mary's Advent festivals. On that day we remember Mary's conception in the womb of her mother (and nine months later, on September 8, we celebrate Mary's birth). In this liturgy, we affirm our belief that God prepared Mary to be the mother of the son of God by allowing her a share, from the moment of her conception, in the salvation that would be won for all by Christ.

Five mothers make their presence felt on December 8. The first is Eve, the mother of all the living. The second is Mary's mother, who conceived, brought to birth, and nurtured an "immaculate" daughter who would become the mother of the Word made Flesh. The third is Elizabeth, who conceived her son John "in her old age." The fourth, of course, is Mary herself. Finally, the letter to the Ephesians and the texts of the Mass for this feast remind us that the Church has been "chosen" to be a spiritual mother. We pray: "The image of the Virgin is found in your Church . . . Trace in our actions the lines of her love, in our hearts her readiness of faith."

In this Advent time, we are called, as Mary was, to make room for Christ in our hearts. What will it take, what will be the cost for us to become, as Mary became, real "bearers of the Word?" Let us be open to the intercession of Mary on our behalf, that we may become more and more like her beloved Son.

NUESTRA FASCINANTE FE

La Inmaculada Concepción (8 de diciembre)

El 8 de diciembre celebramos la solemnidad patronal de los Estados Unidos y la mayor de las fiestas de Adviento de María. Ese día recordamos la concepción de María en el seno de su madre (y nueve meses después, el 8 de septiembre, celebramos el nacimiento de María). En esta liturgia, afirmamos nuestra creencia de que Dios preparó a María para ser la madre del hijo de Dios al permitirle participar, desde el momento de su concepción, en la salvación que sería ganada para todos por Cristo.

Cinco madres hacen sentir su presencia el 8 de diciembre. La primera es Eva, la madre de todos los vivos. La segunda es la madre de María, que concibió, dio a luz y alimentó a una hija "inmaculada" que se convertiría en la madre del Verbo hecho carne. La tercera es Isabel, que concibió a su hijo Juan "en su vejez". La cuarta, por supuesto, es la propia María. Finalmente, la carta a los Efesios y los textos de la misa de esta fiesta nos recuerdan que la Iglesia ha sido "elegida" para ser madre espiritual. Rezamos: "La imagen de la Virgen se encuentra en tu Iglesia... Traza en nuestras acciones las líneas de su amor, en nuestros corazones su disposición a la fe".

En este tiempo de Adviento, estamos llamados, como María, a dar cabida a Cristo en nuestros corazones. ¿Qué nos costará, qué nos costará convertirnos, como María, en verdaderos "portadores de la Palabra"? Estemos abiertos a la intercesión de María en nuestro favor, para que nos parezcamos cada vez más a su amado Hijo.




