

## From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

In our Catholic Tradition we know and believe that we all have to face the Lord on the final judgement day. We do have hope in His Mercy. We do trust in His promises. Probably due to our overindulgence in the world and its bombarding messages, we tend to keep this hope and trust on the back burner while anxiously keeping ourselves busy with whatever the world is pressing us to. This awareness is challenging and confronting us. The most important question is, why do we ignore the Lord and keep busy with the world? The same problem we inherit from the first parents: the serpent made it so appealing and so enticing that they easily slipped into the enjoyment mode! Was it because they were not aware of the rule and the need to do what is pleasing to God? The moment the selfish agenda attracted their minds, their devotion to God and their freedom to live in His presence slipped away. Selfishness moves us to defy even God and ignore our friendship with Him.

Don't we see, even today, in our marriages, parent-children dynamics in our families, even in our ordinary human friendships, a reflection of the same dynamics? From a psychological point of view, Love and Spirituality are two things that either will grow or deteriorate and cannot stay the same all the time. That means we have to make personal effort and vigilantly keep working on improving them always. This leads to two questions: are we living in the presence of the Lord, and are we constantly and consciously working on improving our relationship with Jesus.

The truth of the matter is, we are too anxious to please the world than to obey the Lord. We can see the same logic working today. The way the world is pushing its agenda is very enticing and self-gratifying. Though our faith is truly strong and our desire for salvation is all the more intense, our falling victim to the temptations is very frequent. The reasons are very obvious. There was a time when the spiritual atmosphere was nurtured and respected in the public. It was easy for a believer to be holy. Now spirituality is ostracized, faith values are prohibited from the public arena, which makes it a real challenge for an average person to continue practicing the "old ways". More than that, morality is shunned, sin and guilt are banished from common parlance, self-gratification and pleasurable exploits are promoted through the assertive liberal agenda world. It is easy to claim victim of the age, but it is really challenging to be a true believer and a genuine follower of Jesus. We have to make a conscious effort to keep our eyes focused on the Lord and our hearts melting for Him. We have to pray incessantly for the grace to remain faithful to the Lord and keep our Hope and Trust fixed in God alone.

It is our responsibility to train our children this habit of maintaining an emotional attachment with Jesus with a caution to avoid worldly ideas from contaminating their religiosity and a sense of right and wrong in their lives. God bless you all.

En nuestra Tradición Católica sabemos y creemos que todos tenemos que enfrentar al Señor en el día del juicio final. Tenemos esperanza en Su Misericordia. Confiamos en Sus promesas. Probablemente debido a nuestra excesiva indulgencia en el mundo y a sus mensajes, tendemos a mantener esta esperanza y confianza en segundo plano mientras nos mantenemos ocupados ansiosamente con lo que el mundo nos está ofreciendo. Esta conciencia nos desafía y nos enfrenta. La pregunta más importante es: ¿por qué ignoramos al Señor y nos mantenemos ocupados con el mundo? El mismo problema que heredamos de los primeros padres: la serpiente lo hizo tan atractivo y tan tentador que fácilmente se deslizó en el placer! ¿Fue porque no eran conscientes de la regla y la necesidad de hacer lo que es agradable a Dios? En el momento en que los palnes egoísta atrajo sus mentes, su devoción a Dios y su libertad de vivir en Su presencia se desvanecieron. El egoísmo nos mueve a desafiar incluso a Dios e ignorar nuestra amistad con Él. ¿No vemos aún hoy, en nuestros matrimonios, la dinámica de padres e hijos en nuestras familias, incluso en nuestras amistades humanas ordinarias, un reflejo de esa misma dinámica? Desde el punto de vista psicológico, el amor y la espiritualidad son dos cosas que o crecerán o se deteriorarán y no pueden permanecer iguales todo el tiempo. Eso significa que tenemos que hacer un esfuerzo personal y seguir vigilante trabajando en mejorarlo.

Esto lleva a dos preguntas: estamos viviendo en la presencia del Señor, y estamos constantemente y conscientemente trabajando en mejorar nuestra relación con Jesús. La verdad del asunto es que estamos demasiado preocupados por complacer al mundo que obedecer al Señor. Podemos ver la misma lógica trabajando hoy. La forma en que el mundo está impulsando sus planes es muy atractivo y auto-gratificante. Aunque nuestra fe es verdaderamente fuerte y nuestro deseo de salvación es aún más intenso, frecuentemente somos víctimas de las tentaciones. Las razones son muy obvias. Hubo un tiempo en que la atmósfera espiritual fue nutrida y respetada en el público. Era fácil para un creyente ser santo. Ahora la espiritualidad es ostracized, los valores de la fe se prohíben de la arena pública, que le hace un desafío verdadero para que una persona continúe practicando de "maneras antiguas". Más que eso, la moralidad es rechazada, el pecado y la culpa son desterrados del lenguaje común, la autogratificación y las hazañas placenteras se promueven a través del mundo y de sus palnes liberales. Es fácil de ser la víctima, pero es realmente difícil ser un verdadero creyente y un auténtico seguidor de Jesús. Tenemos que hacer un esfuerzo consciente para mantener nuestros ojos enfocados en el Señor y nuestro corazones derritiéndose por Él. Debemos orar incesantemente por la gracia de permanecer fieles al Señor y mantener nuestra Esperanza y Confianza fija en Dios solamente. Es nuestra responsabilidad enseñar a nuestros niños este hábito de mantener un apego a Jesús, con precaución para evitar que las ideas mundanas contaminen su fe y el sentido de lo correcto y lo incorrecto en sus vidas. Dios los bendiga a todos.

In the James Bond movies, 007 has a license to kill. He can shoot all the bad guys he wants without worrying about being charged with murder. God, however, does not issue a license to sin. The first reading from Sirach reminds us that any time we choose between life and death, good and evil, it is our free choice and our responsibility. God may allow us to make bad choices, but God never commands anyone to sin.

Jesus goes even deeper than Sirach. The people of Sirach's time had followed the laws and commandments that governed external actions. But Jesus taught that thoughts and desires that lead to sin can also be freely chosen or rejected.

In the Gospel he gives us some examples.

The first is about killing. Jesus says that anyone who gets angry enough to kill or who looks down on his neighbor as not deserving to live has committed murder in his heart. Because the Eucharist is our sacrament of unity, we should take care to be reconciled with others before coming to the altar. The next warnings are about adultery and divorce, breaches that also begin with interior feelings. Jesus exaggerates when he tells us to cut off a hand or tear out an eye, because he knew how easily we rationalize our feelings and pretend they are harmless. Jesus takes marriage seriously and expects his disciples to do the same. His final example concerns taking oaths. Jesus gets to the point and says that we wouldn't need oaths if we always told the truth and kept our promises. Our faith is based on the knowledge that God keeps promises. Shouldn't we do the same?

**OUR FASCINATING FAITH****The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite  
Order**

On February 17 we honor the seven founding saints of the Order of the Servants of the Virgin Mary. Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene and Buonagiunta were a group of merchants of Florence who, upon experiencing an apparition of the Blessed Virgin in 1233, renounced their businesses, left what was necessary for their families, and distributed the rest among the poor. They then dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an Italian mountain, each assuming the life of a hermit—prayer, extreme fasting and penance. Sometime later, at the request of the pope's delegate, all but one were ordained priests. Brother Alexis, considering himself unworthy of the priesthood, decided to remain as a brother. They were all canonized in 1888. Their feast day, originally February 11, now falls on the 17th, the date of the death of the last of the seven founders. Brother Alexis died at the age of 110.

**NUESTRA FASCINANTE FE****Los siete santos fundadores de la Orden de  
los Siervos**

El 17 de febrero honramos a los siete santos fundadores de la Orden de los Siervos de la Virgen María. Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene y Buonagiunta eran un grupo de comerciantes de Florencia que, al experimentar una aparición de la Santísima Virgen en 1233, renunciaron a sus negocios, dejaron lo necesario para sus familias y distribuyeron el resto entre los pobres. Luego se dedicaron por completo a la veneración de la Virgen María, yendo a vivir a una montaña italiana, asumiendo cada uno la vida de un ermitaño: oración, ayuno extremo y penitencia. Tiempo después, a petición del delegado del Papa, todos menos uno fueron ordenados sacerdotes. El hermano Alexis, considerándose indigno del sacerdocio, decidió permanecer como hermano. Todos fueron canonizados en 1888. Su fiesta, originalmente el 11 de febrero, cae ahora el 17, fecha de la muerte del último de los siete fundadores. El Hermano Alexis murió a la edad de 110 años. **\*\*Sacrament of Marriage** - Couples should contact the Pastor (336-629-0221) at least 6 months prior to the wedding date for necessary preparation.




